

Telerehabilitation for Older Adults Certification (TRC)

Clinical Tools to Effectively Deliver Rehabilitation Remotely to Older Adults for Improved Patient Outcomes

Course Description

The Telerehabilitation for Older Adults Certification (TRC) provides clinicians important resources to deliver physical rehabilitation using telerehabilitation. This course is designed to empower clinicians with the knowledge to incorporate telerehabilitation into their regular practice to serve older adults better.

Participants will gain in-depth knowledge of how to apply telerehabilitation using current evidence to screen, examine, and treat older adults. Participants will also learn communication skills for older adults and ways to improve patient motivation to improve functional outcomes.

Several treatment interventions are described in this course that can be delivered through telerehabilitation. In addition, the Certification provides evidence-based examination tools to use with telerehabilitation.

Upon completion of the course, participants will be certified (TRC) to apply telerehabilitation in an effective and efficient manner for older adults in both group and individualized treatment plans to achieve greater patient outcomes.

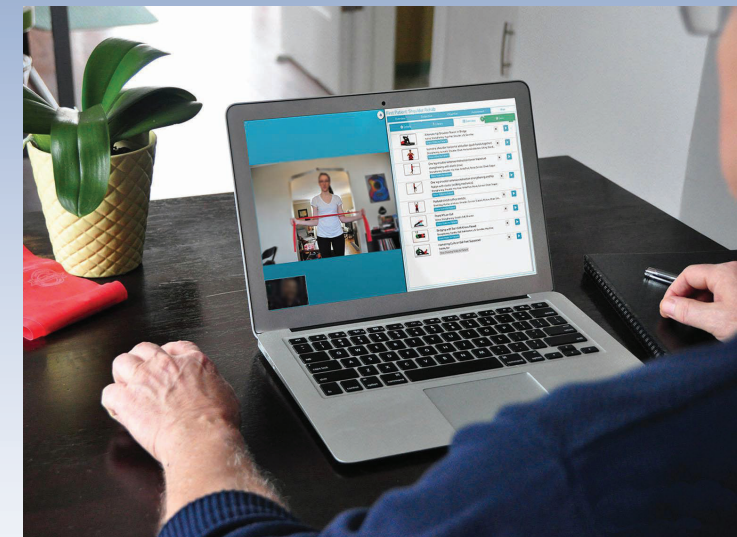
1. Describe patient and therapist views of telerehabilitation

7. Describe the advantages and challenges delivering rehabilitation with telerehabilitation.
8. Discuss clinical screening and examination tools for multiple conditions including gait and balance, posture, pain, cardiopulmonary, stroke, and Parkinson's disease.
